## REPORT on ENDVIEW MEETING

As you may know by now, there was a meeting held on Wednesday, August 31<sup>st</sup> at the Lee Hall fire

training facility. The purpose was for the Sandler's to present their plan for their new development of Asheton, a legacy community at Endview and Lee Hall. I won't bore you with the pretty pictures and house and street details. Know that the plan has changed somewhat from what we all had been shown before. Here is what is important to us. City Council members present noted that this plan has not been approved yet - for whatever that is worth. Next, dates. Mr. Sandler proposes to begin work in about one year (2006) on the area closest to Jefferson Avenue. I know that without his maps it doesn't make much sense, but I'll bring the booklet given out to the Chesapeake Civil War days to explain this in greater detail. About three years after that, after the homes sell, they plan to develop what is called the retail section. Envision this area as across the street from the 7-11 down to the entrance to Endview. Five years later, the rest of the development, around Endview gets done. Then they'll hit the area around Lee Hall. Total project should take ten years. The 90 acres preserved around Endview includes the battlefields. From the charts, it seems that they are going to cut really, really, really close to where the cabins now are, and there seems to be a new lake added there. So, there you have it!
